## **Article 10: Just Transition**

Thank you very much madame co-Chair,

For Indonesia, implementation is as important as ambition.

Therefore, Indonesia emphasize the importance of just transition in the global endeavours to end plastic pollution, including in the marine environment, that includes sustainable development dimensions, to more circular economies including throughout the value chain of plastics for the workforce, and the creation of decent work and quality jobs in accordance with nationally defined development priorities.

To ensure the effective implementation of the Convention, the realization of a means of implementation commitment is critical. Indonesia underlines the importance of ambition to enhance sound waste management and better circular economy system, but it must be based on the implementation of effective commitments, through financial support, technology transfer, technical assistance, scientific collaboration, and capacity building. We therefore encourage the international cooperation, donor countries, and other relevant stakeholders to lead these efforts.

Indonesia is always open to international cooperation, including foreign investment, innovative funding, and technology transfer based on the spirit of equal and mutually beneficial partnership.

Taking into account the role that circular economy and just transition could play as part of the strategy to prevent and reduce plastic pollution, as well as to create and promote sustainability while also considering social equity, Indonesia would like to add *circular economy* to be promoted and facilitated as well in the cooperation framework between parties, in this Article 10: Just Transition.

In Addition, Indonesia would also like to add *local communities* after "Indigenous People" as a group of people adversely affected from a plastic pollution.

In doing so, the paragraph would be read as follows:

[1. In the implementation of this Convention, Parties shall cooperate to promote and facilitate a transition towards sustainable production consumption of plastic **and circular economy**, taking account of the situation of workers in the informal sector, including waste pickers, Indigenous Peoples **and local communities** populations affected by the adverse effects on human health and the environment of plastic pollution and the implementation of measures set out in this Convention.
