Article 9 – Existing Plastic Pollution (non-paper)

Kingdom of Saudi Arabia's submission Rename to "Legacy Plastic Waste"

Acknowledging the historical responsibility of developed country Parties in legacy plastic pollution. **Reaffirming** the principles of common but differentiated responsibilities (CBDR) as a cornerstone of international cooperation in addressing global plastic pollution.

Acknowledging that delayed action by developed country Parties has exacerbated plastic pollution, creating cumulated hotspots of plastic pollution. Developed country Parties **shall** identify, evaluate and prioritize cumulative plastic pollution hotspots and locations most affected.

Developed countries **shall** report data on previous plastic waste exported to and illegal dumping in developing country Parties, and any new exports of plastic waste to developing country parties.

Developed country Parties **shall** provide capacity building, technology transfer, and financial support to developing country Parties with regards to any plastic waste exported to developing country Parties

Decides to establish Legacy Plastic Waste work programme to collect data and information on existing and legacy plastic pollution.

Each Party is **encouraged** to promote safe and environmentally sound remediation activities, including through engagement with local population, communities, and citizens.
