Article 5 Design UK

- 1. Each Party shall take measures to:
 - a. promote **the** design of plastic products in order to:
 - reduce the use of primary plastics and increase reuse and the use of recycled plastics, including through design standards and targets,
 - II. improve the safety and durability of plastic products and promote the use of safe and sustainable chemicals,
 - III. **improve** their ability to be reused, **refurbished**, **refilled**, repaired, recycled and disposed of in a safe and environmentally sound manner upon becoming waste, including through implementation and scaling of solutions and systems, and in accordance with the waste hierarchy,
 - IV. minimize emissions and releases of plastic pollution, including littering and releases of microplastics,
 - b. foster research, innovation, development and use of sustainable alternatives and non plastic substitutes, including products, technologies and services, taking into account the best available science, and, where relevant, traditional knowledge, knowledge of Indigenous Peoples and local knowledge systems and their potential for waste reduction and reuse, as well as their environmental, socio-economic, and human health impacts across their life cycle.
- 2. The Conference of the Parties shall, in order to achieve the objectives in paragraph 1, adopt an additional annex in accordance with Article 24 identifying product design requirements, following a sectoral approach. Each Party shall comply with the requirements, if any, set out in the annex.
- 3. The Conference of Parties shall establish a schedule of work, following a sectoral approach, to support the implementation of this article and make recommendations to the Conference of the Parties.
