

## Statement of Mongolian Delegation on Opening plenary

Thank you, Chair, distinguished delegates, and colleagues,

It is an honor to address the second part of the fifth session of the International Negotiating Committee. As we convene today, we share a collective responsibility to confront the escalating threat of plastic pollution.

Plastic waste affects all nations. It harms ecosystems, endangers human health, and impedes sustainable development. Mongolia recognizes the urgency of this crisis and the pressing need for a coordinated global response.

We support the establishment of clear and achievable obligations for all Parties across the full life cycle of plastics—from production and design to use and disposal. At the same time, we underscore the importance of accommodating differing national capacities and ensuring that the instrument provides meaningful financial and technical support to developing countries.

Transparency regarding plastic composition, particularly with respect to hazardous chemicals, is essential for protecting both human health and the environment. Mongolia further encourages flexible approaches to product design that are responsive to national contexts and avoid creating unnecessary barriers to trade.

We also emphasize the need for a financial mechanism that is inclusive, easily accessible, and responsive to the needs of the most affected countries.

As we enter into detailed negotiations, Mongolia remains committed to working constructively with all Parties to achieve a strong and balanced agreement. We reaffirm our full support for the INC's mandate and for a legally binding instrument that delivers real and lasting solutions to the global plastic crisis.

Let us seize this opportunity and move forward together toward a cleaner, safer, and more sustainable future.
