

**Submission on Sustainable Production and Consumption (Article 6) from:**

Angola, Benin, Botswana, Burkina Faso, Burundi, Cabo Verde, Cameroon, Central African Republic, Chad, Comoros, Congo, Cote d'Ivoire, Djibouti, Equatorial Guinea, Eritrea, Eswatini, Ethiopia, Gabon, Gambia, Ghana, Guinea, Guinea-Bissau, Kenya, Lesotho, Liberia, Madagascar, Malawi, Mali, Mauritania, Mauritius, Mozambique, Namibia, Niger, Nigeria, Rwanda, Sao Tome and Principe, Senegal, Seychelles, Sierra Leone, South Sudan, Sudan, Togo, Zambia, Zimbabwe

1. The Conference of the Parties shall, at its first session, adopt in annex [X] a global target to reduce the production and consumption of primary plastic polymers to sustainable levels and promote the circular economy.
2. Each Party shall take measures across the lifecycle of plastics, from production and product design to waste prevention and management, to achieve the global target in paragraph 1 and annually report, through the secretariat, on the measures taken and statistical data on the types, quantities and uses of primary plastic polymers produced, imported and exported.
3. Each Party shall establish and implement, as soon as practicable but no later than three years upon becoming a Party, a system for licensing the production, import and export of primary plastic polymers.
4. The Conference of the Parties shall, at its first session, adopt the methodology for establishing baseline levels in paragraph 1, formats and timing for submitting annual reports in paragraph 2 and guidelines for licensing systems in paragraph 3.
5. The Conference of the Parties shall, every five years, based on the statistical data and other relevant information provided by the Parties, assess Parties' progress toward the global target for the sustainable production and consumption of primary plastic polymers, and update the global target or adopt global targets for future years, as appropriate, based on the best available science.
6. Parties shall cooperate to ensure that developing country Parties have adequate means of implementation to meet their commitments under this Article.
